

PhD course on Financial Intermediation

1-5 September 2008, Aarhus School of Business, University of Aarhus

Lecturer: Professor Mark Flannery, University of Florida

The course will treat the theory and practice of financial intermediation, broadly construed to include banks, savings institutions and investment/merchant banks.

Topics will include some or all of the following:

- The role of banking firms in a developed capital market
- Their impact on corporate financial decisions for nonbanking firms
- What we might have learned from the recent U.S. subprime mortgage crisis
- Regulatory efforts and market discipline
- Securitization – pros and cons
- Finance and growth

Participants will be provided with a list of readings to be done in advance or during the week we are meeting, and are strongly encouraged to present their own work during the week.
